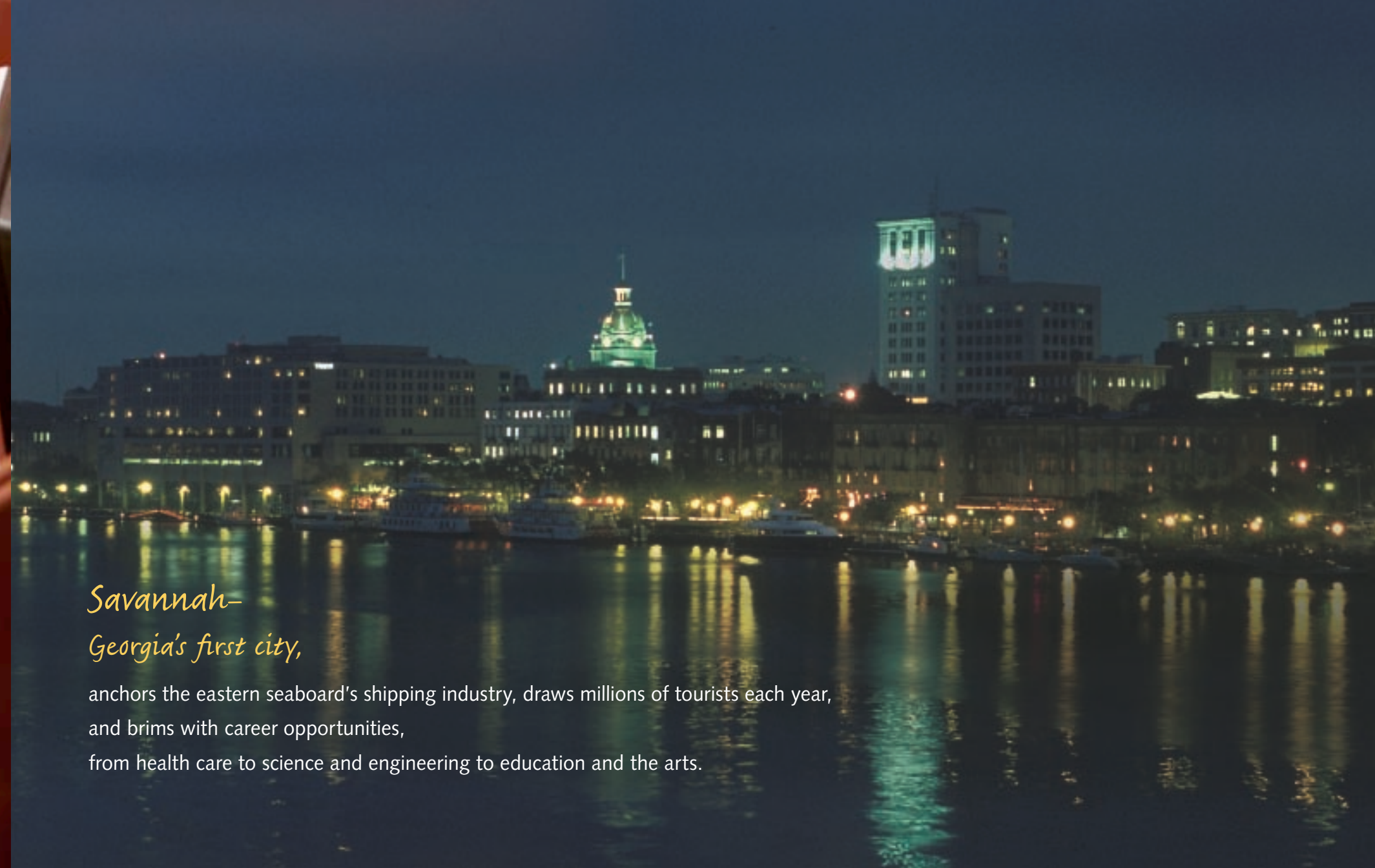

At Armstrong, you find a diverse community of learners from across different backgrounds, generations, experiences—and even from more than 80 nations.

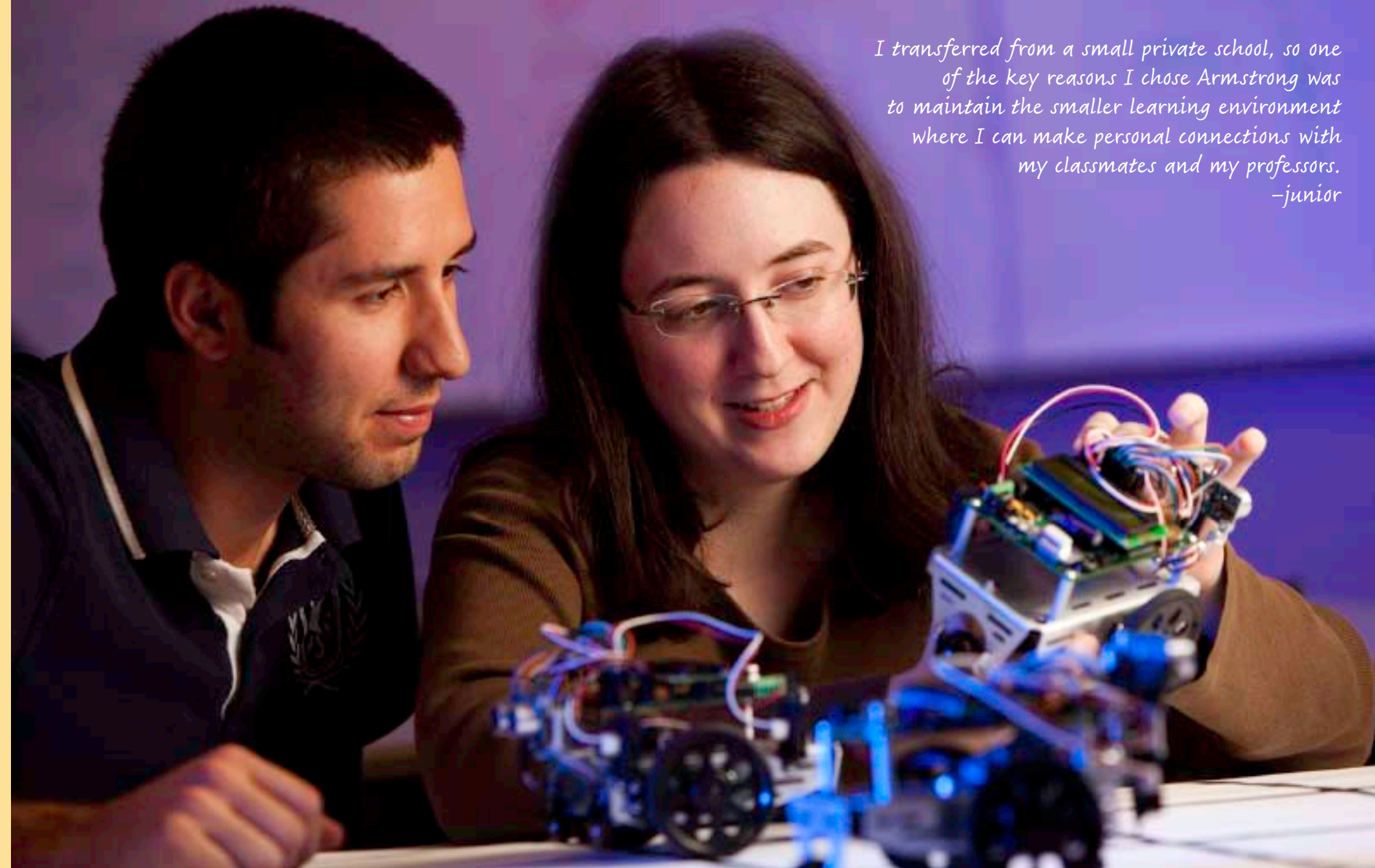
And for every student's needs, we offer a curriculum that fits.

When it's time to put down your books, you don't have to look far to have fun.



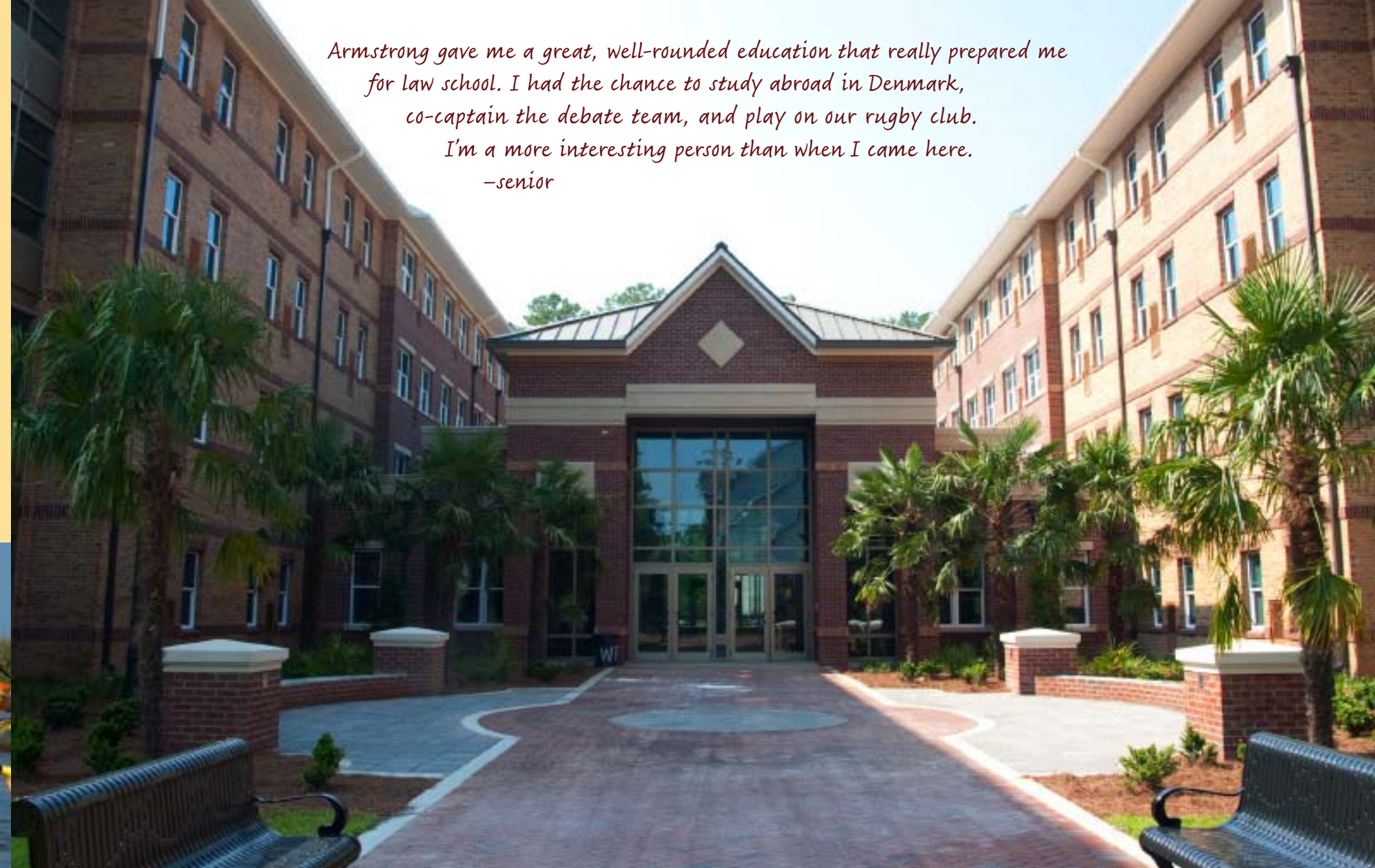
Armstrong = your new home
